

Mildred is a grieving mother frustrated by the local police's failure to find her daughter's killer. In an effort to track down the culprit, she has three billboards erected outside her town of Ebbing, Missouri, accusing the Sheriff of doing nothing to catch the killer. Thus begins a rapidly escalating and very public feud between Mildred and the town's Police, not least the sheriff's hot-headed deputy. A blistering performance from Frances McDormand lies at the centre of Martin McDonagh's follow-up to In Bruges, a characteristically bold, dark comedy.

Guillermo del Toro intertwines classic 1950s B-movie sci-fi, horror and gothic romance to spellbinding effect, in a film about love, shape-shifting though it may be, and tolerance.

Going to print risks their careers and the freedoms of everyone involved, and President Nixon will do anything to take them down.
