


NT LIVE: ONE MAN, TWO GUVNORS

Yearning to escape his rundown hometown and the rules of his traditional Pakistani household, Javed finds himself caught in between two worlds and must discover if he too is 'Born to Run'. Based on the memoir of Guardian journalist Sarfraz Manzoor, this timely coming of age story proves that the right song has the capacity to transcend race, religion and place, tap into our hearts and help us discover who we really are.

from pursuing his artistic ambitions and never misses a chance to tell him what a disappointment he is to her. A delightfully gentle film, punctuated by delightful moments of humour with poignant performances from its national treasure leads.
